
A Message from Secretary of State Joe Meyer

Wyoming's 2006 Constitutional Amendments

Constitutional Amendment A:

The adoption of this amendment would clarify that all monies deposited in the Permanent Wyoming Mineral Trust Fund are inviolate permanent funds of the state.

Constitutional Amendment B:

The Wyoming Supreme Court has held that school funding must be equalized among all school districts in the state.

The adoption of this amendment would repeal the current limitation on the amount of property tax revenues that may be redistributed by the state through the School Foundation Program Account from school districts with greater property tax revenues to other school districts in the state.

Constitutional Amendment C

This amendment authorizes the creation of permanent funds for two purposes: First, higher education scholarships, which include the current Hathaway scholarship program; and second, improving the quality of higher education. The principal in the funds, regardless of the source of the funds, cannot be expended. The earnings must be used for the purposes specified and the legislature is authorized to regulate how the earnings are used. Earnings from funds in the current Hathaway student scholarship account are intended to be used for college scholarships. The amendment would also allow the funds to be invested as the legislature authorizes, including in stocks.

General Election on November 7, 2006

General Information

In order to register to vote you must meet the following qualifications:

- 1. Citizen of the United States
- 2. 18 years of age by General Election Day
- 3. Resident of the State of Wyoming
- 4. Not currently adjudicated mentally incompetent
- 5. Not been convicted of a felony

How to Register to Vote

An applicant may register to vote in person at the County Clerk's office or by mail, not less than thirty (30) days before an election. You may also register to vote at the polls on Election Day. You can access the Wyoming Voter Registration Application form on our website at: http://soswy.state.wy.us/election/vote.htm.

Not sure if you're registered?

Contact your local County Clerk's office. (County Clerk information is located at the back of this brochure.)

Keep your registration current

- You are registered for 2006 if you voted in the 2004 general election. (Wyoming maintains a registry of voters; you need only register once while living in Wyoming, provided you vote in each general election and do not move.)
- If you move to a different precinct or change your name, notify your County Clerk.
- If you move to a different county you must re-register in that county.
- If you have questions about your registration or where you vote, contact your County Clerk.

What to bring on Election Day

- Valid Wyoming driver license
- If you do not have a valid Wyoming driver license, the last four digits of your social security number

How to find your Polling Place/Precinct

You can call your local County Clerk's office or go to their website to see if a search can be conducted there.

If you do not want to vote for everything on the ballot

If you prefer to not vote for a particular office or item on the ballot, just skip that portion of the ballot.

If you fail to vote on any Constitutional Amendment or initiative, the result is the same as voting against.

Sample Ballots

You may view a sample ballot at your local County Clerk's office.

Write-In Votes

If you want to vote for someone who does not appear on the ballot, you can simply write the name of the candidate in the space provided.

Voting Absentee

You can vote absentee for any reason. Call or write your County Clerk to request an absentee ballot. Remember to return your absentee ballot immediately to assure it will be delivered to the County Clerk's office not later than 7 p.m. on election day.

Voting Assistance

If you require assistance to vote by reason of a disability or inability to read or write English, you may be given assistance by a person of your choice. Also, if you have questions regarding accessibility of your polling place, please contact your County Clerk.
